Defendants, Unknown Owners and Owner's Successors in interest of that certain tract or parcel of land as named in Plaintiff's Original Petition herein having been duly Cited by publication as provided by law, did not answer nor appear in person but KENT McGUIRE, duly appointed as Attorney Ad Litem herein to represent said Defendants did appear and announced ready for trial.

No jury having been demanded all matters of fact and things in controversy were submitted to the Court.

The Court, after considering the plaintiff's pleading and hearing the evidence and

- (3) Plaintiff has not established a perpetual Care Trust Fund under Section 714.003 of the Texas Health and Safety Code, V.A.C.S;
- (4) Plaintiff and its successors have openly, continuously and peaceably used the said tract or parcel of land described in Plaintiff's Original Petition for human burial since 1875 to the present;
- (5) There have been no legal challenges or adverse claims to the Plaintiff's or its successors use of said tract or parcel of land as a private cemetery since 1875 to the present;

(6) Plaintiff and its successors has claimed title to the said property adversely to all other persons and/or entities in the world since 1875 to the present;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the ownership of and title to the following described tract or parcel of land in Ellis County, Texas, in the Bell's Chapel Cemetery in Rockett, Texas, is quieted and is vested in the Plaintiff, being:
